Wolfgang Hallet is Professor of Teaching English as a Foreign Language at Justus-Liebig-University Giessen. He is a member of the Executive Board of the International Graduate Centre for the Study of Culture (GCSC) and Head of the GCSC's Teaching Centre. His research interests include literary and cultural theories, cultural studies approaches to teaching English as a foreign language (EFL), implications of textual and intertextual theories for the EFL classroom, contemporary novels and CLIL.

Marion Williams was formerly Associate Professor in Applied Linguistics at Exeter University, UK, where she co-ordinated the postgraduate programmes in TESOL. She was recently President of the International Association of Teachers of English as a Foreign Language (IATEFL). Her interests and publications focus on the psychological and cognitive aspects of language learning and teaching. Marion currently works with Instill Education group of language schools as chair of their Academic Board.

Dave Allan is the founding Director of NILE, the Norwich Institute for Language Education, which provides training and professional development for some 1,600 teachers a year from around 40 countries worldwide. The author of the Oxford Placement Tests and a long-term co-ordinator for IATEFL TEASIG, he has lectured and run seminars on assessment issues all around the world. He has been a consultant/project leader for major national projects and validation studies.
